4 soldiers die, two injured in Bandipora road accident

BANDIPORA: Four soldiers lost their lives, and two others sustained critical injuries when an Army vehicle skidded off the Bandipora-Srinagar road and plunged into a deep gorge near Suderkoot-Payeen, close to the Wular sunset point in north Kashmir's Bandipora district on

Saturday, officials said.

An official told the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) that the accident occurred due to poor visibility and adverse weather conditions. He said the vehicle veered off the road near SK Payeen and fell into a deep gorge, resulting in serious injuries to six soldiers.

"Police, Army personnel

rushed to the spot to rescue the injured soldiers and evacuate them to the district hospital," the official said. "Two soldiers were declared dead on arrival at the Bandipora District Hospital, while the other four were shifted to a Srinagar hospital for advanced treatment. Tragically, two more soldiers succumbed to their injuries en route to the hospital. The remaining two are

in critical condition." The deceased soldiers have been identified as Lance Naik litender, Havildar Hari Ram, Gunner Nitesh and Pawan Kumar. The injured soldiers are Havildar Balappa and Lance Naik Garili. The Army said the accident occurred due to inclement weather and poor visibility conditions.

SRINAGAR: Amidst the cloudy weather conditions, Jammu and Kashmir would likely receive a major snowfall during the next two days with the weatherman predicting that an active Western Disturbance (WD) would affect the Union Territory from this evening or night.

According to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), under the influence of the WD, a moderate to heavy snowfall is expected for the next 36 hours over most parts of Jammu and Kashmir while moderate rainfall is expected over plains of

Jammu during the same period.

"Heavy to very heavy snowfall is also possible over higher reaches of Kashmir.

Good snowfall is expected over plains of Kashmi including Srinagar City during the next 36 hours, an Independent Weather Forecaster, Faizan Ari Keng, said.

First successful trial run of train on Katra-**Banihal section**

Non-Appearance In Response To Proclamation A 'Stand-Alone Offence': SC

held that non-appearance in response to a proclamation is a "stand-alone offence" and can continue even if the proclamation is extinguished.

The apex court delivered its verdict on January 2 on an appeal challenging a June 2023 judgement of the Punjab and Haryana High Court.

The bench dealt with legal questions, including whether the proclaimed offender status of an accused under the provisions of the CrPC can subsist if he stands acquitted during trial in connection to the very same offence.

"In conclusion, we hold that section 174A IPC is an independent, substantive offence, that can continue even if the proclamation under section 82 CrPC is extinguished. It is a stand-alone offence," a bench of justices CT Ravikumar and Sanjay Karol said.

Section 82 of the erstwhile Code of



Criminal Procedure (CrPC) deals with proclamation for person absconding.

Section 174A of the erstwhile Indian Penal Code (IPC) pertains to nonappearance in response to a proclamation under section 82 of the CrPC.

"The purpose of section 82 CrPC, as

can be understood from a bare reading of the statutory text is to ensure that a person who is called to appear before a court, does so," the bench said, adding that the object and purpose of section 174A of the IPC was to ensure penal consequences for defiance of a court order requiring a

It noted what happens if the status under section 82 of the CrPC was nullified, that is, the person subjected to such proclamation, by virtue of subsequent developments was no longer required to be presented before a court of law.

"Then, can the prosecution still proceed against such a person for having not appeared before a court during the time that the process was in effect. The answer is in the affirmative," it said.

While referring to the language of section 174A of the IPC, the bench said this implies that the "very instance at which a person is directed to appear, and he does not do so, this section comes into play".

"So, while proceedings under section 174A IPC cannot be initiated independent of section 82, CrPC, that is, can only be started post the issuance of proclamation, they can continue if the said proclamation is no longer in effect," the bench said.

"We are repeating with utmost responsibility that the BJP has some vested interest to keep the beautiful border state on the boil, with more than 250 innocent deaths and 60,000 being displaced. People are still living in camps for 20 months." Kharge claimed. DC Kupwara emphasizes on upscaling therapeutic management, proper counseling of drug addicts

KUPWARA: To review the progress made to curb drug abuse in Kupwara district, a meeting of District Level Committee of Narco Coordination (NCORD) was held today under the chairmanship of the Deputy Commissioner (DC) Kupwara, Ayushi Sudan at meeting hall of DC Office Complex, here.





American Hegemony and Its Role in the United Nations: Current Influence and Future Possibilities.

The United States has played a pivotal role in shaping the structure and functions of the United Nations (UN) since its establishment in 1945. As one of the founding members and a permanent member of the UN Security Council, the U.S. has consistently exerted its influence across various domains, from security issues to humani-

peace and security. However, the global landscape has shifted dramatically since the end of the Cold War, with rising powers like China and India, along with regional organisations, challenging the traditional dominance of Western powers in global governance.

This paper examines the multifaceted role of the United States in the United Nations, focusing on its impact on the UN's operational priorities and decision-making processes. The paper also explores the future possibilities of U.S. influence, or control, within the organization as emerging powers contest the existing international order. Ultimately, it seeks to understand whether American hegemony within the UN is sustainable in the 21st century or whether the global leadership structure is poised for transformation. peace and security. Over the years, the U.S. has used its veto power to influence outcomes in conflicts where it has strategic interests, such as in the Middle East (e.g., blocking resolutions critical of Israel) or during the Iraq War. The U.S. is also the largest financial contributor to UN peacekeeping operations, further cementing its leadership role within the organization. This financial dominance allows the U.S. to exert influence on the operations and priorities of peacekeeping missions and humanitarian efforts.

The rise of these powers suggests a shift towards a more multipolar world, in which the U.S. may no longer dominate the decision-making processes at the UN.

2. Changing Attitudes Toward U.S. Hegemony

The political climate in the U.S. has also undergone significant shifts in recent years, with increasing skepticism about the role of international organizations. Under the Trump administration, the U.S. withdrew from several UN bodies, including the UN Human Rights Council and UNESCO, reflecting a retreat from multilateralism. Although the Biden administration has sought to reengage with international organizations, the growing isolationist sentiment in the U.S. may limit its ability to exert influence on the global stage in the long term.

Moreover, U.S. leadership within the UN faces growing opposition from developing nations and emerging powers, who argue that the current international system disproportionately favors the interests of Western powers. The potential for reforms within the UN, such as


expanding the Security Council or altering the veto system, could weaken U.S. influence, especially if new members such as India or Brazil gain more power.

3. The Role of Non-State Actors and Globalisation The rise of non-state actors, including multinational corporations, NGOs, and transnational advocacy networks, also complicates the U.S.'s ability to maintain control over the UN. These actors often work independently of national governments, influencing UN policy through lobbying, funding, and partnerships. Globalisation has made issues like climate change, migration, and health crises (e.g., the COVID-19 pandemic) more complex, requiring multilateral solutions that may not always align with U.S. interests.

Additionally, the increasing importance of regional organisations, such as the European Union (EU) and the African Union (AU), presents alternative centres of influence that may challenge U.S. dominance in global governance. The U.S. may find itself competing for leadership with these rising blocs, which could lead to a more fragmented global order.

The United States has long been a dominant force within the United Nations, influencing its policies and priorities through a combination of economic, military, and diplomatic power. The U.S. continues to shape key aspects of UN operations, particularly in areas of global security and human rights, through its permanent membership on the Security Council and substantial financial contributions. However, as the global power structure becomes more multipolar, the U.S. faces increasing challenges to its hegemonic position, particularly from rising powers like China and Russia. These challenges, coupled with shifting political attitudes in the U.S. and the growing importance of non-state actors, suggest that the future of U.S. control over the UN is uncertain. While the U.S. is likely to remain a key player in international governance, its ability to unilaterally dominate the UN is diminishing. The evolution of global power dynamics will likely lead to a more distributed form of leadership, in which the U.S. shares influence with other major powers in shaping the future of the United States.

Decoding the Rupee's Decline: Causes and Remedies

India's record trade deficit in 2022 due to rising crude oil and gold imports drives rupee depreciation. The fall in the Indian rupee underscores the challenges of maintaining currency stability amid external sector vulnerabilities. Currency fluctuations are triggered by global geopolitical tensions such as the Russia-Ukraine war, rising crude oil prices, and capital outflows, as well as domestic factors such as the fiscal deficit. Effective policy measures are crucial to enhance India's external resilience and stabilize its economy.

Sustained outflows after the September 2024 stock peak weakened the rupee as investors moved to safer assets amid speculation of a rise in US interest rates. Trade deficits, such as the high trade deficit, highlight external dependence on imports, especially for energy, widening the current account deficit during rupee weakness. India's crude oil import bill rose with the rupee depreciation, widening the 2024 trade deficit to close to \$75 billion.

Global events such as tariff threats and the BRICS currency dispute add to volatility by creating uncertainties for India's external trade and investment. The US President's 2024 tariff warning against the currency plans of the BRICS countries triggered a market sell-off, weakening India's external stability. Heavy reliance on foreign exchange reserves to stabilize the rupee restricts long-term monetary flexibility during sustained global market turmoil.

The rupee exhausted more than \$20 billion in reserves in a single quarter to pull the rupee back to 85.53 in December 2024. A weak rupee constrains domestic monetary policies, raising inflation through costlier imports while reducing fiscal space to address growth concerns. The cost of crude oil imports rose 15% in December 2024, putting pressure on policymakers to effectively balance currency management and fiscal expansion strategies.

Protectionist trade measures, such as tariffs or sanctions, can undermine currency stability by disrupting the trade balance. Political instability or conflict between major

economies creates volatility, boosting demand for the safehaven dollar and weakening emerging market currencies. The Russia-Ukraine war led to a surge in global crude oil prices, which put pressure on India's import bill and depreciated the rupee. Tight monetary policies in advanced economies lead of inelastic imports such as crude oil push up India's import bills, weakening the rupee in 2023. A decline in domestic and foreign investment indicates weak economic growth, discouraging currency inflows. In 2024, declining corporate performance and rising stock valuations led to foreign



to capital outflows from India, putting pressure on the rupee. The US Federal Reserve's rate hike plan in 2022-23 led

to foreign portfolio outflows, which weakened the rupee.

India's record fiscal deficit during the pandemic limited government measures to boost external resilience. The government's clear

stance on currency policies boosts investor confidence and reduces speculative pressure. The RBI governor's ruling out of de-dollarization in 2024 reassured the market, temporarily easing concerns of rupee depreciation.

Measures to strengthen external resilience include boosting exports and focusing on value-added manufacturing and services to increase foreign exchange earnings and reduce trade imbalances. Strengthening sectors such as pharmaceuticals and IT can help reduce the trade deficit and stabilize the rupee. Reduce dependence on volatile crude oil and essential imports by entering into long-term agreements with diversified suppliers. Expanding crude oil imports from Russia and Middle Eastern countries reduces average oil import costs in 2023. Build strong reserves through sovereign wealth funds and gold accumulation for effective currency stabilization.

According to the Reserve Bank, record foreign exchange reserves of \$600 billion in 2021 helped manage volatility during the pandemic. Enter into agreements to settle trade in local currencies, reducing dependence on the US dollar and mitigating exchange rate risks. The India-Russia Rupee-Ruble Trading Mechanism eased pressure on foreign exchange reserves during the Russia-Ukraine crisis. Prioritize low-cost and long-term borrowings while reducing short-term external debt to avoid currency risks.

Amid weather advisory, SMC Commissioner says: 'Snow clearance plan in place, resources ready for emergencies'

Srinagar: The Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC) Commissioner Dr Owais Ahmad stated on Saturday that the corporation is fully prepared to address weather and snowfall challenges, with comprehensive measures implemented to ensure smooth operations throughout the winter season.

Speaking to selected news reporters in Srinagar, as reported by the news gathering agency KINS, $the \,SMC\,Commissioner\,stated\,that\,the\,corporation$ is responsible for clearing approximately 1,500 km of roads, along with 5,500 lanes that are manually

The Commissioner highlighted that the SMC's priority system is structured into three categories: Priority 1 includes 500 km of crucial roads, connecting hospitals and essential public services, which are



cleared immediately, even during snowfall. Following that, Priority 2 and Priority 3 cover other roads and residential areas.

He stressed the continuous nature of

the snow clearance operation, explaining that as snow accumulates, the clearing process is repeated. Additionally, to prevent water inundation, the SMC has upgraded 100 drainage stations with power backup and deployed 127 drainage pumps.

The Commissioner assured the public that SMC's snow clearance plan is in place, with resources ready to tackle any emergency or priority needs. Extra machinery has been hired, including modified JCBs, snow clearance machines, and small robotic snow blower machines designed for tight spaces.

He said that in a bid to speed up the manual snow clearance process, the SMC has also ordered hand-held snow blowers, which are currently being tested.

The Commissioner appealed for public cooperation, urging residents to report any issues via the control room or social media handle of the corporation.(KINS)

India successfully met an all-time maximum power demand of 250 GW during FY 2024-25

The year 2024 marked a landmark period for India's power sector, with historic advancements in energy generation, transmission, and distribution. From meeting record power demand of 250 GW to reducing energy shortages at the national level to a mere 0.1% in FY 2024-25, the sector demonstrated resilience and commitment to sustainable growth. Significant strides in energy conservation, consumer amovement and infrastructure development underscore

simplified windows. Window-I permits allocation of coal at "Notified Price" to Central Generating Companies and State Governments. Window-II allows allocation to all generating companies (Central, State, or Private) at a premium over the "Notified Price," irrespective of ownership or nature of PPAs. The new policy aims to support the development of an additional 80 GW of thermal capacity.

MW of Inter-regional Transfer Capacity have been added.

Right of Way (RoW) compensation Guidelines: To ensure the timely development of power transmission infrastructure for evacuating 500 GW of renewable energy by 2030, the Ministry of Power revised the Right of Way (RoW) guidelines in June, 2024, linking compensation to the market value of land. For tower base area, the compensation has been increased from 85% to 200% of the land value. For the

on-grid electricity connections under RDSS. To date, a total of 4,355 crore has been sanctioned for the electrification of 9,61,419 households, including those from PVTGs and tribal communities, along with public places identified under the DA-JGUA initiative.



EV Charging Guidelines: Guidelines for Installation and Operation of Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure-2024 have been issued to support creation of a nationwide connected and inter operable EV charging network. This will help increase the chargers from 34,000 presently to about 1 lakh by 2030. These guidelines are expected to create a robust, safe, reliable, and accessible EV charging network, enhance the viability of charging stations, encourage use of solar energy for electric vehicle charging, and prepare the electricity grid to handle increased demand of EV charging.

Sustainable Building Codes Issued: India has taken a major step towards a greener future with the introduction of two new building codes: the Energy Conservation and Sustainable Building Code (ECSBC) for commercial buildings and the Eco Niwas Samhita (ENS) for residential buildings. The revised codes apply to large commercial buildings and multi-storied residential complexes with a connected electricity load of 100 kW or more, which means the codes will impact big offices, shopping malls and apartment buildings, and will help in reduction of 18% electricity consumption. Additionally, it incorporates sustainability features related to natural cooling, ventilation, water, and wastewater disposal. States may adopt these building codes.

has notified the Carbon Market. The Ministry of Power has notified the Carbon Credit Trading Scheme, empowering industries to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and earn carbon credits. This initiative fosters investments in transformative technologies, positioning India as a leader in global green finance. It is intended to operationalize the trading of certificates of mandatory sectors by October 2026 and of voluntary sectors by April 2026.

Unnat Jyoti by Affordable LEDs for ALL (UJALA): UJALA programme was launched in 2015 under which LED bulbs, LED Tube lights and Energy efficient fans are being sold to the domestic consumers for replacement of conventional and inefficient variants. Till date, over 36.87 crore LED bulbs, 72.18 lakh LED Tube lights and 23.59 lakh Energy efficient fans have been distributed by EESL across India. This has resulted in estimated energy savings of 48.41 billion kWh per year with avoided peak demand of 9,789 MW, GHG emission reduction of 39.22 million ton CO2 per year and estimated annual monetary savings of INR 19,335 crore in consumer electricity bills.

· Street Lighting National Programme (SLNP): SLNP was launched in 2015 to replace conventional street lights with smart and energy efficient LED street lights across India. Till date, EESL has installed over 1.31 crore LED Street Lights in ULBs and Gram Panchayats across India. This has resulted in estimated energy savings of 8.82 billion kWh per year with avoided peak demand of 1,471 MW, GHG emission reduction of 6.08 million ton CO2 per year and estimated annual monetary savings of INR 6,179 crore in electricity bills of municipalities.

Reforms and Initiatives

Rights of Consumers Rules: Electricity Rules were notified in February 2024 to empower electricity consumers. This framework lays down their rights and provides mechanisms to enforce them. The rules ensure timely access to services such as new connections, grievance redressal, and billing transparency while facilitating rooftop solar adoption and electric vehicle (EV) integration. Key provi-

o Simplifying rooftop solar installation processes with exemptions from technical $\,$

feasibility study for systems up to 10 kW.

o Allowing separate connections for EV charging stations to promote clean mobility.

o Reducing timelines for new connections: 3 days in metros, 7 days in municipal areas, and 15 days in rural regions (30 days for hilly terrain).

o Mandating consumer rights for separate metering and billing in residential

colonies, enhancing transparency and fairness.

o Introducing mandatory check meters to verify con-

sumption in case of complaints.

Additional Surcharge elimination: The Electricity Rules, 2005 have been amended in 2024 to rationalise open access charges. New rules now allow large consumers (open access consumers) to buy electricity from the cheapest sources across India, not just from their local Distribution Licensee. Some State regulators charge large consumers heavily to buy electricity from other sources. In an effort to reduce these charges, the additional surcharge levied is now being gradually reduced and will be completely removed within four years. Importantly, large consumers who have never bought electricity from their distribution licensee are not required to pay additional surcharge.

Computer Security Incident Response Team – Power (CSIRT–Power): Union Minister for Power inaugurated Computer Security Incident Response Team – Power (CSIRT–Power) facility in September, 2024. Equipped with advanced infrastructure, cutting-edge cybersecurity tools, and key resources, CSIRT-Power is now well-prepared to tackle emerging cyber threats. With a dedicated team of experts, it is set to become a cornerstone of the sector's cyber defence, coordinating incident response, establishing a strong cybersecurity framework, and implementing crucial measures to enhance overall preparedness and resilience.

· Record Demand Met: India successfully met an alltime maximum power demand of 250 GW during FY 2024-25.

 \cdot Sharp Reduction in Power Shortages: Due to significant additions in generation and transmission capacities, energy shortages at the national level have reduced to a mere 0.1% in FY 2024-25, a major improvement from 4.2% in FY 2013-14.

· Rise in Per Capita Electricity Consumption: Per capita electricity consumption in India has surged to 1,395 kWh in 2023-24, marking a 45.8% increase (438 kWh) from 957 kWh in 2013-14.

· Universal Electrification Achieved: Villages and households across the country have been electrified, marking a significant milestone in India's power sector.

· Improved Power Availability: The average availability of electricity in rural areas has increased from 12.5 hours in 2014 to 21.9 hours, while urban areas now enjoy up to 23.4 hours of power supply, reflecting substantial improvements in the reliability and reach of electricity services.

Generation:

· Significant Growth in Installed Capacity: India's total installed power generation capacity has surged by 83.8%, increasing from 249 GW as of March 31, 2014, to 457 GW as of November 30, 2024*.

· Major Expansion in Renewable Energy: Since April 2014, 129 GW of renewable energy capacity, including large hydro, has been added. This includes 91 GW of solar power, 27 GW of wind power, 3.2 GW of biomass, 1.3 GW of small hydro, and approximately 6.3 GW of large hydro generation capacity, demonstrating India's strong commitment to clean energy.

· Award of thermal projects: To address the peak demand of India's rapidly expanding economy, the Government has awarded 19.2 GW of new coal-based thermal capacity. The total installed capacity of coal and lignite-based thermal plants now stands at 217.5 GW. An additional 29.2 GW of capacity is under construction, with 13.4 GW expected to be commissioned in FY 2024-25. A further 36.3 GW of capacity is in versions of planning, alcorporate and hidding.

Coal Stock Position: As of March, 2024, Domestic Coal-Based (DCB) power plants held a coal stock of 47.8 MT. As of December, 2024, these plants hold 41.4 MT of coal which is targeted to increase to 50 MT by March 2025. Sustained coal supply during Q1 and Q2 of FY 2025 ensured meeting the peak demand of 250 GW in May 2024. With improved domestic coal availability, the Ministry of Power discontinued its advisory for blending imported coal beyond October 15, 2024.

Revision of SHAKTI Policy: The Government of India is reviewing the coal allocation policy to encourage private sector participation. The revised policy proposes two

2024 has approved Heo Hydro Electric Project (186 MW) in Arunachal Pradesh. The project will be completed in 50 months at a cost of 1939 Cr.

· CFA for HEPs NER: Union Cabinet in its meeting held on 28th August, 2024 has approved the scheme of "Central Financial Assistance (CFA) towards equity participation by the State Govts. for development of Hydro Electric Projects (HEPs) in North Eastern Region (NER)". Under this scheme, the equity portion of the State Government of NER (capped at 24% of the total project equity, subject to a maximum of 750 crore per project) would be funded through this scheme. The scheme will be implemented during the period from FY 2024-25 to FY 2031-32, with a total financial outlay of 4136 crores.

outlay of 4136 crores.

Enabling Infrastructure HEPs: Union Cabinet Union Cabinet in its meeting held on 11th September, 2024 has approved the scheme of "Modification of the Scheme on Budgetary Support for the Cost of Enabling Infrastructure for HEPs". Total outlay of the scheme is 12461 crores for the period from FY 2024-25 to FY 2031-32. A cumulative hydro capacity of approximately 31 GW, including 15 GW of PSP capacity, would be supported under the scheme.

· Pump Storage Projects (PSP): India has the potential of PSPs of about 181 GW with around 5 GW (2.6%) developed so far. Government has set an ambitious target of adding 35 GW PSP capacity by 2031-32 out of which, 6 GW is under construction and rest is under development stage.

Battery Energy Storage System (BESS): Under the Viability Gap Funding (VGF) Scheme for development of BESS, a capacity of 13,000 MWh is targeted for addition.

Transmission

National Electricity Plan: Govt. of India has finalised National Electricity Plan from 2023 to 2032 for Central and State transmission systems to meet a peak demand of 458 GW by 2032. The total cost of the plan is Rs 9.15 lakh Cr. Under the previous plan 2017-22, about 17,700 circuit kilometers (ckm) lines and 73 GVA transformation capacity were added annually. Under the new plan, transmission network in the country will be expanded from 4.91 lakh ckm in 2024 to 6.48 lakh ckm in 2032. During the same period the transformation capacity will increase from 1,290 Giga Volt Ampere (GVA) to 2,342 GVA. Nine High Voltage Direct Current (HVDC) lines of 33.25 GW capacity will be added in addition to 33.5 GW presently operating. Inter-Regional transfer capacity will increase from 119 GW to 168 GW. This plan covers the network of 220 kV and above. This plan will help in meeting the increasing electricity demand, facilitate RE integration and green hydrogen loads into the grid.

• 50 GW ISTS Capacity Approved: 50.9 Giga Watt of Inter State Transmission Projects costing Rs. 60,676 Cr has been approved. The transmission network required to connect 280 GW of Variable Renewable Energy (VRE) to the Inter-State Transmission System (ISTS) by 2030 is planned to be 335 GW. Out of this, 42 GW has already been completed, 85 GW is under construction, and 75 GW is under bidding. Balance 82 GW will be approved in due course.

· Improvement in Transmission System: During 2024, 10,273 ckm of transmission lines (of 220 kV & above), 71,197 MVA of transformation capacity (of 220 kV & above) and 2200

Major Expansion in Renewable Energy: Since April 2014, 129 GW of renewable energy capacity, including large hydro, has been added. This includes 91 GW of solar power, 27 GW of wind power, 3.2 GW of biomass, 1.3 GW of small hydro, and approximately 6.3 GW of large hydro generation capacity, demonstrating India's strong commitment to clean energy.



RoW Corridor, compensation has been raised from 15% to 30% of the land value.

 \cdot Revamped Distribution Sector Scheme (RDSS): Under RDSS which aimed at improving operational efficiencies and financial sustainability of Discoms, 19,79,24,902 prepaid Smart meters, 52,52,692 DT meters and 2,10,704 Feeder meter have been sanctioned at a cost of INR 1,30,670.88 Cr. Loss Reduction works of ~INR 1.46 lakh Cr. have been sanctioned and Rs 18,379.24 Cr have been released towards loss reduction works under RDSS. As a result of reform measures taken under the scheme, AT&C losses have come down to 15.37% and ACS-ARR gap has reduced to Rs. 0.45/kWh in FY2023.

Yellow, Orange

Z-Morh Tunnel

Minister Narendra Modi later this month, though no official date has been confirmed yet.

"The Z-Morh Tunnel is fully ready for public use, but we are still awaiting formal approval from New Delhi. We hope to receive the go-ahead soon," an official said.

He said the tunnel has the potential to boost tourism and ease travel hardships. "This tunnel will make our lives much easier, especially during the harsh winters. Located at an altitude of 8,500 feet, the tunnel will provide all-weather access and boost military logistics to Ladakh, a region critical to national security.

The project was first envisioned by the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) in 2012, with construction later taken over by the National Highways & Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd (NHIDCL). Originally slated for completion in October 2024, the tunnel was recently opened on an emergency basis to clear traffic stranded due to heavy snowfall and slippery road conditions on the highway.

The tunnel is expected to play a crucial role in ensuring safer, year-round connectivity for civilians and military operations alike, eliminating the snow-related challenges that often block the Srinagar-Leh highway

"These are the domiciliary laws that we want," he said. However, Singh feels not everything about the abrogation of Article 370 is negative.

He said the abrogation scrapped a law that took away the property rights of women from the state who married outsiders and also enabled many people who migrated from Pakistan to exercise their franchise.

"So I took a very nuanced view. Some things are positive in it," he said.

Decades ago, Singh had proposed trifurcation of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir. He proposed that Jammu should be merged with Himachal Pradesh, Ladakh should be made a union territory and Kashmir should remain a state.

"Everyone jumped at me and the proposal was rejected. Today things are different. Jammu has its own personality now," he said.

Asked if he had any such radical proposal now, he said, "I think that now the only radical suggestion is the reinstatement of statehood plus domiciliary laws to safeguard the people of the state and a genuine attempt to strike a fair balance between Jammu and Kashmir

The only way to do this is to have a peaceful relationship between the Centre and the Jammu and Kashmir government, he underlined.

On August 5, 2019, the Centre revoked Article 370 of the Constitution, stripping Jammu and Kashmir of its special status and dividing it into two union territories - J&K and Ladakh. While the former has a legislative assembly with limited authority, Ladakh operates without one.

In December 2023, the apex court upheld the Centre's decision but reiterated the need for the swift restoration of statehood.

During the interview, Singh also reflected on his relationship with the Abdullah family, particularly with Sheikh Mohammed Abdullah, the first chief minister of Jammu and Kashmir.

He described Sheikh Abdullah as a "remarkable" Kashmiri leader who significantly influenced the region's political landscape, but acknowledged the complexities of their interactions given the historical tension between the monarchy and the emerging democratic forces.

Recalling the time when Jammu and Kashmir's first assembly was constituted, Singh said his father Maharaja Hari Singh and many of his loyalists thought that he should not take up the role of 'Sadr-i-Riyasat' because Sheikh Abdullah had insulted the Dogras and the Maharaja.

"So that was where the tension in a way began. I suppose it was an inevitable fallout of politics. You see, I realised that the monarchy had lost its importance. That the future lay in democracy. I wanted to be part of that democracy," he said.

Singh credited National Conference (NC) president Farooq Abdullah for bringing him back into politics after a 12-year hiatus.

Augment accessibility

Coordination New GMCs, MD, JKMSCL, Project Director,AIDS Control Society, Medical Superintendents, CMOs of concerned district and other senior officers of health and medical education department attended the meeting.

During the meeting, the Minister assessed medical infrastructure, human resources, medical supplies and equipments as well as emergency preparedness of each district. She also took detailed appraisal regarding functioning of PHCs, CHCs, SDHs and district hospitals of all these districts.

Addressing the officers in the meeting, Sakeena Itoo stressed upon them for maximising accessibility of healthcare services in rural areas especially during winters. She called upon them for posting of specialists and adequate staff in PHCs and CHCs so that people get best medical care in their vicinities without moving to tertiary care hospitals.

The Minister also stressed upon the officers for enhancing the existing mobile health services for reaching out to remote areas more effectively.

While reviewing progress on ongoing projects in these districts, Sakeena Itoo impressed upon the officers for timely completion of these projects as they are vital for filling the gaps of progressive health care services for people. She further encouraged the officers to prioritise establishment of more diagnostic centers and specialty services at district hospitals in order to cater to the increasing health needs of the people and reduce burden on tertiary care hospitals.

The Minister also called upon all Medical Superintendents to display rates of all diagnostic tests at designated places in their respective hospitals for ease of common masses.

PM Modi

he resolved his mind and was encouraged to tackle the challenges faced by them. He further added that the development works being undertaken today in the rural areas are inspired by the lessons and experiences from the villages. Modi said that since 2014, he has been constantly in the service of rural India.

"Ensuring a dignified life for the people of rural India is the priority of my Government", exclaimed the Prime Minister. He added that their vision was to ensure an empowered rural India, provide ample opportunities for villagers, reduce out migration and ensure ease of life of the people of villages. Therefore, he said, the Government had implemented a program in each and every village to ensure basic amenities. Modi highlighted that every house was provided with a toilet as part of Swachh Bharat Mission, crores of people in rural India were given pucca houses as part of PM Awaas Yojana and lakhs of houses in villages were ensured safe and clean drinking water through Jal Jeevan Mission.

"Today, Health facilities are being provided in more than 1.5 lakh Ayushman Arogya Mandirs to the people", said the Prime Minister. He added that Telemedicine, assisted by digital technologies, has ensured the option of best doctors and hospitals to the villages. Crores of people in the rural areas have benefited from the telemedicine through e-Sanjeevini, he further added. Modi remarked that during the COVID-19 pandemic, the world wondered how India's villages would cope. He added that however, the Government ensured that vaccines reached the last person in every village.

The Prime Minister highlighted the importance of creating economic policies that consider every section of rural society to strengthen the rural economy. He was pleased that over the past 10 years, the government has formulated special policies and made decisions for every section of the village. Modi remarked that just a few days ago, the Cabinet approved the extension of the PM Crop Insurance Scheme for another year and decided to continue the subsidy on DAP. He emphasised that the government's intentions, policies, and decisions are infusing new energy into rural India.

The Prime Minister underscored the goal of providing maximum economic assistance to villagers within their villages, enabling them to engage in farming and create new employment and self-employment opportunities. He noted that through the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi, farmers have received approximately Rs 3 lakh crore in financial assistance. Noting that over the past 10 years, the amount of agricultural loans has increased by 3.5 times, Modi mentioned that now livestock and fish farmers are being provided with Kisan Credit Cards. He added that in addition, more than 9,000 Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) in the country are receiving financial assistance. He further underlined that the government has consistently increased the MSP for several crops over the past 10 years.

Modi highlighted the launch of campaigns like the Swamitva Yojana, through which villagers are receiving property papers. He remarked that over the past 10 years. several policies have been implemented to promote MSMEs. The Prime Minister emphasized that MSMEs have benefited from the Credit Link Guarantee Scheme, with over one crore rural MSMEs reaping its benefits. He noted that today, rural youth are receiving support from schemes like the Mudra Yojana, Start-Up India, and Stand-Up India.

The Prime Minister highlighted the significant contribution of cooperatives in transforming the rural landscape. He remarked that India is on the path to prosperity through cooperation, and for this purpose, the Ministry of Cooperation was established in 2021. He noted that around 70,000 Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) are being computerized to ensure that farmers and villagers get better value for their products, thereby strengthening the rural economy.

Modi emphasised that apart from agriculture, various traditional arts and skills have been prevalent in our villages, such as blacksmithing, carpentry, and pottery. He remarked that these occupations have significantly contributed to the rural and local economy, but were previously neglected. He added that to enhance their skills and provide affordable assistance, the Vishwakarma Yojana is being implemented, giving lakhs of Vishwakarma artisans an opportunity to progress.

"When intentions are noble, the results are satisfying", said Modi. He added that the country is now reaping the benefits of the hard work done over the past 10 years. Citing a recent large-scale survey that revealed several important facts, Modi noted that compared to 2011, consumption in rural India has nearly tripled, indicating that people are spending more on their preferred items. He noted that previously villagers had to spend more than 50% of their income on food, but for the first time since independence, the expenditure on food in rural areas has fallen below 50%. He explained that this meant the people are now spending on other desires and needs. improving their quality of life.

Highlighting another significant finding from the survey, which revealed that the gap in consumption between urban and rural areas has decreased, the Prime Minister remarked that it was previously believed that urban individuals could spend more than those in villages, but continuous efforts have reduced this disparity. He emphasized that numerous success stories from rural India inspire us.

The Prime Minister noted that these achievements could have been realized during previous governments' tenures, but for decades after independence, lakhs of villages were deprived of basic necessities. He pointed out that the majority of SC, ST, and OBC populations reside in villages and were neglected by previous governments. This led to migration from villages, increased poverty, and a widening gap between rural and urban areas. Citing an example of the previous perception of border villages as the last villages of the country, Modi stated that his government has given them the status of the first villages and launched the Vibrant Villages Scheme for their development. He highlighted that the development of border villages is increasing the income of their residents. He emphasized that those who were previously ignored are now being prioritized by his government.

The Prime Minister mentioned the launch of the PM Janman Yojana for the development of tribal areas, ensuring equal rights for regions that were deprived of development for decades. He remarked that over the past 10 years, his government has corrected many mistakes of previous governments. He emphasized that the government is moving forward with the mantra of national development through rural development. Modi highlighted that as a result of these efforts, 25 crore people have been lifted out of poverty in the past 10 years, with the majority being from rural areas. He mentioned a recent study by the State Bank of India, which revealed that rural poverty in India has decreased from approximately 26% in 2012 to less than 5% in 2024. He noted that while some people have been chanting slogans to eradicate poverty for decades, the country is now witnessing a real reduction in poverty.

Emphasising the significant role of women in India's rural economy and the government's efforts to expand this role, Modi remarked that women are redefining rural life as Bank Sakhis and Bima Sakhis, and are leading a new revolution through self-help groups. He noted that 1.15 crore women in villages have become Lakhpati Didis and the government aims to make 3 crore women Lakhpati Didis. He added that special schemes were also being implemented for women from

Dalit, deprived, and tribal communities. Underscoring the unprecedented focus on rural infrastructure, the Prime Minister highlighted that most villages are now connected to highways, expressways, and railways. He noted that under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana, approximately 4 lakh kilometer of roads was constructed in rural areas over the past 10 years. "Villages are becoming modern 21st-century villages in terms of digital infrastructure", said the Prime Minister. He noted that over 94% of rural households now have access to telephones or mobile phones and banking services and world-class technology like UPI was available in villages. India 141 for 6 (Pant 61, Boland 4-42) and 185 lead Australia 181 (Webster 57, Smith 33, Prasidh 3-42, Siraj 3-51) by 145 runs

During the lunch break on the second day, Rohit Sharma cleared the air, saying that he had sat out of the Sydney Test and that he wasn't retiring from Test cricket yet. Soon after the break, Jasprit Bumrah, who had taken over from Rohit as captain, left the SCG for scans. Australia had lost half their side around that time, with the game-and the series-dangling on a razor's edge. Despite the absence of Bumrah, India snatched a four-run first-innings lead, turning the Sydney Test into a second-innings shootout.

Rishabh Pant pulled India further ahead with a jaw-dropping 29-ball half-century. It was the second-fastest fifty by an Indian in Test cricket, behind his own 28-ball effort against Sri Lanka in 2022. After Scott Boland had carved up India's top order with pinpoint accuracy, Pant countered them and thrilled a Sydney crowd of 47,257. The late dismissals of Pant and Nitish Kumar Reddy kept the game in the balance, with India leading by 145 at stumps.

The second-innings shootout, though, could get skewed in favour of Australia if Bumrah isn't fit to bowl anymore in this Test.

India's support bowlers, though, stepped up admirably on the second day, with Prasidh Krishna and Reddy sharing five wickets among them. India's non-Bumrah seamers came away with combined figures of 8 for 132 - their best in any innings on this tour.

Reddy picked up two wickets in two balls other audacious reverse-ramp, prompting while Prasidh marked his Test comeback with the scalps of Steven Smith, Alex Carey and debutant Beau Webster, who top-scored for Australia with 57 off 105 balls.

Webster continued his excellent debut,

Bumrah to post a fielder at deep third.

In the next over, however, Mohammed Siraj had Konstas edging to gully for 23 off 57 balls with an outswinger. Three balls later,



becoming the first Australian since Adam Voges in 2015 to score a half-century on Test debut.

The day had dawned with Bumrah snaring Marnus Labuschagne for 2 and throwing a stare at non-striker Sam Konstas. Bumrah surpassed Bishen Singh Bedi's tally for the most wickets taken by an India bowler on a tour of Australia.

The 19-year-old responded strongly with the bat when he advanced at Bumrah and shanked him down the ground for four. Then, after Bumrah reinforced the slip cordon by bringing deep third in, Konstas unfurled anhe had Travis Head caught at second slip for 4. Where Bumrah and Australia's quicks hit the deck, the source of Siraj's menace was swing. So, he kept exploring a fuller length to maximise that swing.

Smith and Webster steadied Australia with a 57-run partnership for the fifth wicket before Smith fell to Prasidh at the stroke of lunch. Smith seemed destined to reach 10,000 Test runs but moments before the break Prasidh shifted his stock length to an even more fuller one to dismiss him five short of the landmark.

Then, in the afternoon, he stormed through

the defences of Alex Carey with a similar length. Reddy rocked Australia even further with the wickets of Pat Cummins and Mitchell Starc. Australia lost their last four wickets for just 19 runs to be bowled out for 181.

Yashasvi Jaiswal then launched India's second innings in grand style, scything Starc for four fours in the first over. KL Rahul, too, showed some attacking intent at the other end until Boland (who else?) intervened and curtailed India's rapid start.

He struck in his second over when he had Rahul chopping an inducker onto his stumps and in his next over, he knocked Jaiswal over with a beauty that angled in towards middle from around the wicket and seamed away late to beat the outside edge and smash the top of off stump. Boland proceeded to dismiss Virat Kohli in familiar fashion, for 6. It was the eighth time that Kohli was out edging behind to the keeper or the slip cordon in nine trips to the crease in this Border-Gavaskar Trophy. He was so angry that he yelled at himself and punched himself in the leg.

Webster earned his maiden Test wicket when he had Shubman Gill caught behind off the inside edge.

After having spent nearly 150 minutes being someone else with the bat on the first day, managing 40 off 98 balls, the real Pant stood up on the second. He charged at his first ball from Boland, who had just snared Kohli, and violently clubbed him over mid-on for six. He then ventured a reverse-ramp off his third ball, and though he failed to connect, he didn't curb his natural instincts in this innings.

Rickelton's marathon 259, Verreynne century thump hapless Pakistan

akistan's horror day in Cape Town was complete after South Africa ripped through their top order to leave them staring down the barrel of a huge defeat. Having posted $615\,thanks\,to\,a\,double\text{-}hundred\,from\,Ryan$ Rickelton and a century from Kyle Verreynne, South Africa's quicks Kagiso Rabada and Marco Jansen tore through a Pakistan line-up already missing the injured Saim Ayub. So effectively, South Africa are six wickets away from making Pakistan bat again, with the visitors a mammoth 551 runs behind after day two.

Having taken command before lunch, South Africa ground Pakistan into the dust in the afternoon. Rickelton ended up with 259, falling just short of Stephen Fleming's 262 as the highest score at Newlands. Verreynne brought up his fourth Test hundred. Jansen, out of form with the bat all year in 2024, heralded the new year with a whirlwind half-century. Six fours and three sixes helped him get there in 42 balls. Thus, as many as 137 runs were added in the second session, with South Africa having surged to 566 for 7 by tea, already their highest score at home in four years.

Pakistan gamely battled on, but their efforts never looked like bearing fruit on a wicket that had long since flattened, and batters that had long since settled. Much of the second session became a milestone-marking exercise. Verreynne continued with the belligerence that had lit up the first session, a boundary off Mohammad Abbas and a single off the next ball bringing up three figures. It brought Newlands to its feet once more; they may have sore legs from the frequency with which they had to do that.

Salman Ali Agha struck next over to prise him out as Verreynne went for a slog sweep, but it did little to stymie South Africa's momentum. With no scoreboard pressure, Jansen let his natural talent speak for itself, swinging freely and timing it beautifully. He took 11 balls to get off the mark, but once he did, there was no stopping him. Two fours and a six off Khurram Shahzad in $two\,successive\,overs\,helped\,bring\,up\,the\,50\,partnership$ in 46 balls, while each of Rickelton and Jansen helped

Rohit says he 'stood down' for SCG Test: 'It is not a retirement decision'

ohit Sharma's decision to sit out of the Sydney Test shouldn't be misconstrued as a retirement decision, he has said. He is confident "things can change" and those with a "mic, pen or laptop can't decide when we should retire."

Rohit was reacting to media reports in India that had brought his Test future into sharp focus following India's loss in the fourth Border-Gavaskar Test in Melbourne, which all but ended their chances of qualifying for the WTC final.

"This decision is not a retirement decision," he told Star Sports during the lunch break on day two of the Sydney Test, in which Jasprit Bumrah is captaining India. "Nor am I going to take myself out of the game.

"I sat out of this match because runs are not coming off my bat. There is no guarantee runs won't come five or two months down the line. I have seen a lot in cricket that life changes every second, every minute, every day.

"I have confidence in me that things can change, but at the same time I have to be realistic as well. So life won't change by what people with a mic, pen or laptop write or say. They can't decide when we should retire, when we should sit out, when we should captain. I am a sensible man, mature man, father of two kids. So I know what I need in life."

Rohit, India's Test and ODI captain, missed the start of the Test series on paternity leave. After joining the squad midway through the series opener in Perth, which India won by 295 runs, Rohit slotted into the middle order for the Adelaide and Brisbane Tests to accommodate KL Rahul at the top of the order.

In Melbourne last week, Rohit returned to open the batting with Yashasvi Jaiswal, with Rahul slotting in at No. 3 and Shubman Gill losing out on a place in the XI. However, two failures and a loss on a dramatic final day led to chatter around his place in the XI.

Rohit didn't do his usual pre-match press conference a day out from the final Test, and head coach Gautam Gambhir sidestepped questions on Rohit's participation, stating a call would be taken after looking at the pitch.

"I made this decision after coming here [to Sydney]," Rohit said. "We had only two days between the matches. On New Year's, I didn't want to have this chat with the selector and the coach. But it was in my mind that I am trying my best but I am not getting the runs. I have to accept it and have to get myself out of the way.

"The chat that I had with the coach and the selector was very simple: my bat is not scoring runs, I am not in form, this is an important match, and we need players who are in form. As it is, the boys are not in great form. So I had this simple thought in my mind: we can't carry out-of-form players.

"That's why I thought I should tell the coach and the selector what's going on in my mind. They backed my decision. They said you have been playing for so many years, you are the best judge of what you are doing."

Rohit's form has been a concern for a while. He had averaged 13.30 over ten innings against Bangladesh and New Zealand during the 2023-24 home season. And he presided over a 3-0 defeat to New Zealand, India's first home-series loss
